

COMPETITION CHECK LIST 2022 Mexico City

Congratulations on winning your National Jeunes Chefs Competition. The following list will allow you to come prepared to the competition. All items in **BOLD are mandatory.**

Visa

Some countries require a visa to enter Mexico and all countries are required to fill out a Tourist Card. Click

https://www.visasmexico.com/entry-requirements/#countries

to see if citizens of your country require visas. Remember that it can take up to 2 months to get a visa.

Current health requirements for Mexico: Mexico requires all visitors to complete a Health Questionnaire and bring a printed copy when entering the country. Be aware of the rules in your country upon re-entry. Please read the information on the Tourist Mexico website https://www.visasmexico.com/travel-health-form/ Will you need to have a negative COVID-19 test prior to getting on an airplane to return home? If so please advise Lois Gilbert Committee Jeunes Chefs On-Site Manager lois.gilbert@me.com of your return requirements. Also please check with your Bailliage that they will cover the cost of testing in Mexico and costs for quarantining in your home country. We expect things to change by October so please monitor the information frequently and stay informed.

Electrical

In Mexico the standard voltage is 127 V and the frequency is 60 Hz . You can use your electric appliances in Mexico, if the standard voltage in your country is in between 110 - 127 V (as is in the US, Canada and most South American countries). Remember, if you are bringing kitchen appliances that do not meet these standards, you will need to bring a convertor as it will not be supplied. Universal adaptors will not work and will blow the appliance motor.

Your companion may act as your translator but will only translate your menu after you have written it and may not consult with you. We provide translators for German and French only so please make sure that there is someone available from your country's Bailliage to assist in translation. Please discuss this with your sponsor.
